Participation in the Lord's Supper - Part 2

How should we participate? (1 Cor 11:17-34)

I. The situation at Corinth (17-22)

Perversion of the Lord's Supper: "For in eating, each one takes his own supper ahead of others; and one is hungry and another is drunk." (v. 21)

- a. "There are divisions among you" (v. 18; cf. 1:10-12; 3:1-4)
- b. You have a selfish disregard for each other: "each one takes his own supper ahead of others; and one is hungry and another is drunk." (v. 21; cf. Jer 7:9-10; Isa 1:15)

KEY TEXT: "Therefore when you come together in one place, it is not to eat <u>the</u> <u>Lord's Supper</u>." (v. 20)

II. The significance of the meal (23-26)

Purpose of the Lord's Supper: "Do this in remembrance of Me"

- a. Specifically his suffering and death (cf. Phil 2:2-8)
- b. "...pride and self-worship cannot flourish in the soul that keeps fresh in memory the scenes of Calvary." *Desire of Ages*, p. 661.

KEY TEXT: "For as often as you eat this bread and drink this cup you proclaim <u>the Lord's death</u> till he comes." (v. 26)

III. The seriousness of abuse (27-32)

Preparation for the Lord's supper: "Let a man examine himself"

- a. Does my attitude reflect the sacrifice being commemorated?
- b. Is my attitude the attitude of Jesus Christ?

KEY TEXT: "For he who eats and drinks in an unworthy manner eats and drinks judgment to himself, not discerning <u>the Lord's body</u>." (v. 29)
