David Brown: Tithes & Offerings (16/2/19)

Introduction:

Have you ever been dared to do something? Maybe when you were in school some of your friends might have dared you to do something mischievious or devious. Unfortunately a dare often comes in the form of a challenge to do something that you shouldn't do. But a dare doesn't have to be a negative thing. Sometimes a dare could be just the challenge that you need to take your life to the next step!

When I was young I wasn't a particularly daring individual. I was quite content to be on two feet on the ground! Then one day our primary school held what they called 'bike week.' This meant that for a whole week there were enough bikes for every age, size and ability brought to our school, along with the staff who were to train us to ride (there particular focus was on road safety).

For a little bit of context as to why that would have anything to do with being 'daring,' let me explain to you my history with push bikes. I had tried to go from my training wheels to riding without them when I was still quite young and fallen off. 'Well dah,' you might be saying, 'every kid falls off when they first move on from training wheels.' But apparently I was one of those kinds of kids that liked to be sure of everything before I even started it;) Mum tells me I didn't even start walking until I had sufficiently calculated my ability against the risk. So it was with riding a bike. I stopped trying after my falls when I was quite young and was content to ride around on my scooter and other toys instead. The problem came when - years later - at 'bike week' I was unable to ride a bike. But, with the dare of one of my friends as all the motivation I needed, I pushed off into the unknown and learned to ride that bike within minutes. For me, that was just the challenge that I needed in order to take that next step in learning how to ride a bike.

It is in that way that God 'dares' us to take a step out in faith with our money.

Yes, that's right, today we will be talking about money.

This journey will be communicated through the channel of the book of Malachi.

Malachi is an interesting book. It can be summarised by saying that it is like an argument with a rebellious teenager. There are six (or seven - depending on who you ask), disputes that make up the framework of the book.

The Book of Malachi:

Dispute #1: God says "I love you!" Israel responds "*How have you shown us your love?*" God responds "I chose you to carry the covenant promises."

Dispute #2: God says "Where is my honour? You pollute my name & my temple!" Israel responds "How are we violating you?" God responds "You're content with lame sacrifices."

Dispute #3: God says "You've dealt treacherously with your wives & turned against me & them!" Israel responds "How?" God says "You haven't been faithful to your wives."

Dispute #4: Israel says "You have neglected us! Where is the God of justice?" God responds "I will send my messenger to prepare the way before me & I will bring justice!"

Dispute #5: God says "You've gone away from my ordinances. Return to me!" Israel responds "How shall we return to you?" God responds "Start returning the tithe again!"

Dispute #6: God says "You have misrepresented me!" Israel responds "How?" God responds "You have said 'It is pointless to serve God! The wicked prosper, etc"

As you can see, God was thoroughly frustrated with these people! And rightfully so. They were incorrigible!

1) Ownership:

"The earth is the Lord's and the fulness thereof; the world and they that dwell therein." **Psalm 24:1**
